**RESOLUTION #2008-3.4
OF THE GOVERNING BODY
OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE**

*Authorizing Submission to the State of New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety,
Division of Highway Safety of an Application for
"Click It or Ticket" Seat Belt Mobilization Grant Funding*

WHEREAS, the Governing Body ("Governing Body") of the Borough of Bloomingdale ("Borough") finds and declares that the State of New Jersey, Department of Transportation, Division of Highway Safety ("State") has announced its 2008 "Click It or Ticket" Enforcement Mobilization ("Click It or Ticket"), during which from May 19, 2008 through June 1, 2008, law enforcement agencies in New Jersey and nationwide will be engaging in zero-tolerance enforcement of safety belt laws with paid advertising and the support of government agencies, local coalitions and school officials in order to increase safety belt use and defend against one of the greatest threats to us all — serious injury or death in traffic crashes; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body further finds and declares that Click It or Ticket is a high-publicity law enforcement effort that utilizes the increased threat of a traffic ticket to spur more motorists to put on a safety belt; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body further finds and declares that Click It or Ticket campaigns and similar efforts have increased safety belt use across our Nation, including in New Jersey, where numerous police departments and agencies, including the Bloomingdale Police Department, participated in the previous Click It or Ticket Enforcement Mobilization, as a result of which New Jersey's seat belt usage rate rose to an all-time high; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body further finds and declares that the Bloomingdale Police Department is prepared to fully and aggressively participate in the 2008 Click It or Ticket Mobilization; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has learned that the State is presently accepting grant applications for 2008 Click It or Ticket Seat Belt Mobilization Grant Funding; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body finds and declares that it is in the best interests of the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the Borough, the County of Passaic and the State of New Jersey for the Governing Body to authorize the submission to the State of an application for grant funding to finance the following project:

***Supporting the “Click It or Ticket” Seat Belt Mobilization of
May 19, 2008 – June 1, 2008***

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale does hereby declares its full support for the “Click It or Ticket” Seat Belt Mobilization, both locally and nationally, during the period of May 19, 2008 – June 1, 2008, and does further pledge to promote awareness of the mobilization and the benefits of safety belt use; and

**RESOLUTION #2008-3.5
OF THE GOVERNING BODY
OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE**

***Declaring the Intention of the Bloomingdale Borough Council to Encourage More of
Bloomingdale’s Children to Get to School Safely Under Their Own power, and to Encourage
Efforts to Improve the routes those Children Take to Get to School Safely***

WHEREAS, there is a decline in the extent to which Bloomingdale children walk and bike to school; and

WHEREAS, walking and biking to school supports childhood health by encouraging active lifestyles and reducing childhood obesity; and

WHEREAS, walking and biking to school increases children’s ability to interact with elements of the community and social environment; and

WHEREAS, walking and biking to school increases the readiness of students to learn when they arrive at school; and

WHEREAS, more children walking and biking to school will reduce traffic congestion in school zones, resulting in improved air quality and reduced fuel consumption; and

WHEREAS, non-infrastructure law enforcement initiatives will increase community attention to traffic laws pertaining to pedestrians while helping school children walk and bike to school safely, which benefit the entire community; and

WHEREAS, physical infrastructure improvements such as sidewalks and bikeways increase community safety to all pedestrians, primarily school children, which benefit the entire community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Borough Council endorses the following goal:

All Bloomingdale school children who are able to walk or bike and who live within reasonable distances from school can get to school under their own power in reasonable safety; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Borough council will participate with other community organizations in developing and promoting strategies to implement this goal.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE, IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 3. The Borough has determined not undertake the construction of a Library and Civic Center. Therefore, the Borough hereby repeals \$940,517 remaining unspent under Bond Ordinance No. 1-2005 finally adopted June 21, 2005. The Borough has issued bond anticipation notes under Bond Ordinance No. 1-2005 and will use the \$940,517 to pay the principal of the outstanding bond anticipation notes at maturity. The Borough hereby also repeals \$1,500,000 under Bond Ordinance No. 25-2005 finally adopted November 29, 2005, \$998,933.50 under Bond Ordinance No. 27-2006 finally adopted June 20, 2006 and \$2,600,000 under Bond Ordinance No. 37-2006 finally adopted December 19, 2006.

Section 4. Section 3(f) of Bond Ordinance No. 1-2005, Bond Ordinance No. 25-2005, Section 3(d) of Bond Ordinance No. 27-2006 and Bond Ordinance No. 37-2006 are hereby repealed and shall be of no effect as of the effective date of this bond ordinance, except for amounts previously expended thereunder.

Section 5. This Bond Ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE #4-2008

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE AMENDING CHAPTER V, ANIMAL CONTROL, CODE SECTION 5-14a1(b), OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale finds and declare that it in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Borough to amend Chapter V, Animal Control, Code Section 5-14a1(b) of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Bloomingdale;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale as follows:

Section 1. Chapter V, Animal Control, Code Section 5-14a1(b), hereby is amended to change “sixteen (\$16.00) dollars” to “fifteen (\$15.00) dollars.”

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent necessary.

Section 3. If any article, section, subsection, term or condition of this Ordinance is declared invalid or illegal for any reason, the balance of the Ordinance shall be deemed severable and shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication in the manner provided by law.

Councilwoman Altfield moved for the adoption of the ordinance; seconded by councilman Sloomaker and carried as per the following roll all: council members: Altfield; Vroom; Huntley; Sloomaker; Marinaro and Specchio all YES.

At this time, Councilman Specchio thanked the Borough Administrator, DPW Superintendent and water/Sewer Superintendent for their work during the recent water main break.

LATE PUBLIC COMMENT

Councilman Specchio moved that the meeting be opened to Late Public Comment; seconded by councilman Vroom and carried on voice vote with all Council members voting YES.

Since there was no one else who wished to speak under public comment, Councilwoman Altfield moved that it be closed; seconded by Councilman Vroom and carried on voice vote with all Council Members voting YES.

ADJOURNMENT

Because there was no further public business to be conducted, Councilwoman Altfield moved to ADJOURN the meeting; seconded by Councilman Vroom and carried on voice vote with all members voting YES.
