PUBLIC NOTICE STATEMENT

Mayor Steenstra stated that adequate notice of this meeting was posted in the Bloomingdale Municipal Building and provided to The Suburban Trends; The North Jersey Herald & News; and all other local news media on January 6, 2010.

PRESENTATION TO BLOOMINGDALE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THEIR CPR SAVE

At this time, recognition was given to the following members of the Bloomingdale Police Department for their response to a call for an unresponsive male on Van Dam Avenue on March 14 whereby CPR was administered to Hank Van Dolk, saving his life.

Councilwoman Huntley read a statement as to the quick response of the Police for her neighbor while the flooding was also going on the borough at the same time.

Police Chief Borell thanked the officers for their efforts and spoke in regard to the training, etc. of his Department.

Mr. Van Dolk was in attendance and thanked the Police Department for their help in saving his life.

The presentation was roundly applauded by all those in attendance.

PRESENTATION BY DEBORAH HOFFMAN OF PASSAIC COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN REGARD TO GRANT FUNDING

At this time, Deborah Hoffman of the office of Passaic County Economic Development was in attendance in regard to a survey which was done at the Brandt Lane property, i.e. old sewer treatment plant.

Mr. Joseph Dempsey; Jeanine Mitchel and Laura Brinkerhoff were also in attendance. Ms. Brinkerhoff gave a slide presentation and commentary of their environmental assessment of this property and outlined their recommendations to the Mayor and Council for the cleanup of this site of the five areas of environmental concern.

Mayor Steenstra opened the meeting up to the public for questions but there was no one who wished to speak.

Consensus that Ms. Hoffman will arrange a meeting with the Borough Administrator and other officials to go over their recommendations and assessment.

EARLY PUBLIC COMMENT

Councilman Specchio moved to open the meeting for Early Public Comment on agenda items; seconded by Councilman Marinaro and carried on voice vote.

Jennifer Altfield, 17 Cedar Street, spoke in regard to adoption of an animal by a friend of hers and fact that the animal came from Kentucky and was not checked out by a New Jersey Veterinarian while at BASS; questioned the legality of this and if the animal was quarantined for ten days.

Ms. Altfield asked the Borough Attorney to find out what the difference was between a rescue center and an animal shelter. She also wanted to know how many out of state animals were brought to BASS from out of state and how much money was made.

Geraldine DeLazier, 20 Glenwild Avenue, asked what were the Mayor and Council's thoughts on the assessment made by the County of the old sewer plant.

Borough Administrator Ehrenburg stated that this was not something we requested; the State determined that it was a site they wanted to look at; discussion followed in regard to Brownfields cleanup funding.

Since there was no one who wished to speak under Early Public comment, Councilman Specchio moved that it be closed; seconded by Councilman Vroom and carried on voice vote.

OF THE GOVERNING BODY
OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE**

TO AFFIRM THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE'S CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY WITH RESPECT TO ALL OFFICIALS, APPOINTEES, EMPLOYEES, PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC THAT COME INTO CONTACT WITH MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES, OFFICIALS AND VOLUNTEERS

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the borough of Bloomingdale to treat the public, employees, prospective employees, appointees, volunteers and contractors in a manner consistent with all applicable civil rights laws and regulations including but not limited to the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 as subsequently amended, the New jersey law

against Discrimination, the American with disabilities Act and the Conscientious Employees Protection Act, and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Bloomingdale has determined that certain procedures need to be established to accomplish this policy

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

Section 1: No official, employee, appointee or volunteer of the Borough of Bloomingdale by whatever title known, or any entity that is in any way a part of the Borough of Bloomingdale shall engage, either directly or indirectly in any act including the failure to act that constitutes discrimination, harassment or a violation of any person's constitutional rights while such official, employee, appointee volunteer, or entity is engaged in or acting on behalf of the Borough of Bloomingdale's business or using the facilities or property of the Borough of Bloomingdale.

Section 2: The prohibitions and requirements of this resolution shall extend to any person or entity, including but not limited to any volunteer organization or inter-local organization, whether structured as a governmental entity or a private entity, that receives authorization or support in any way form the Borough of Bloomingdale to provide services that otherwise could be performed by the Borough of Bloomingdale.

Section 3: Discrimination, harassment and civil rights shall be defined for purposes of this resolution using the latest definitions contained in the applicable Federal and State laws concerning discrimination, harassment and civil rights.

Section 4: The Borough Administrator shall establish written procedures for any person to report alleged discrimination, harassment and violations of civil rights prohibited by this resolution. Such procedures shall include alternate ways to report a complaint so that the person making the complaint need not communicate with the alleged violator in the event the violator would be the normal contact for such complaints.

Section 5: No person shall retaliate against any person who reports any alleged discrimination, harassment or violation of civil rights provided however, that any person who reports alleged violations in bad faith shall be subject to appropriate discipline.

Section 6: The Borough Administrator shall establish written procedures that require all officials, employees, appointees and volunteers of the Borough of Bloomingdale as well as all other entities subject to this resolution to periodically complete training concerning their duties, responsibilities and rights pursuant to this resolution.

Section 7: The Borough Administrator shall establish a system to monitor compliance and shall report at least annually to the governing body the results of the monitoring.

Section 8: At least annually, the Borough Administrator shall cause a summary of this resolution to be communicated within the Borough of Bloomingdale. This

communication shall include a statement from the governing body expressing its unequivocal commitment to enforce this resolution. This summary shall also be posted on the Borough of Bloomingdale's web site.

Section 9: This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Section 10: A copy of this resolution shall be published in the official newspaper of Bloomingdale in order for the public to be made aware of this policy and the Borough's commitment to the implementation and enforcement of this policy.

**Authorizing Submission of State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act Tonnage Grant Application
on Behalf of the Borough of Bloomingdale**

WHEREAS, the Governing Body ("Governing Body") of the Borough of Bloomingdale ("Borough") finds and declares that the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act ("Act"), P.L. 1987, c. 102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grants may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body further finds and declares that it is the intent and spirit of the Act that municipalities use tonnage grants to continue and expand existing municipal recycling programs and to develop new programs designed to promote recycling; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body further finds and declares that the New Jersey Legislature has empowered the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP") to implement the Act through the promulgation of regulations that

impose upon municipalities, as a condition for applying for such tonnage grants, certain requirements that include compiling and maintaining accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by each such municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body further finds and declares its intention that this Official Resolution shall serve to memorialize the Borough's continuing commitment to recycling and the Borough's acceptance of its obligations under the requirements imposed by the Act and its implementing regulations;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body further finds and declares that its intention that this Official Resolution shall also serve to memorialize the formal designation by Mayor William Steenstra confirmed by the Borough Council, and Borough Administrator Ted Ehrenburg as the Borough's Recycling Coordinator and duly authorized representative, entrusted with the responsibility to ensure that the Borough's Recycling Tonnage Grant Application under the Act is properly completed and timely filed with NJDEP:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale does hereby authorize the submission on behalf of the Borough of a Recycling Tonnage Grant Application to the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection under the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act and does hereby confirm the appointment of the Borough's Recycling Coordinator, DPW Superintendent Al Gallagher, as the duly authorized representative of the Borough who shall be entrusted with the responsibility to ensure that said Application shall be properly completed and timely filed with NJDEP; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale does hereby direct all necessary and appropriate municipal officials to cause any and all funds received pursuant to said Application to be deposited in a dedicated recycling trust fund to be appropriated solely for the promotion of recycling with the Borough.

Councilman Vroom moved that the Ordinance be read by title:

ORDINANCE No. 3-2010

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF
BLOOMINGDALE AMENDING BOROUGH CODE
SECTION 2-64.11, FEES FOR RECREATIONAL
PROGRAMS**

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale, upon the recommendation of the Board of Recreation Commissioners, has determined that certain recreation fees to be charged for Borough recreational programs must be adjusted due to increased program costs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale, that the Code of the Borough of Bloomingdale hereby is amended as follows:

Section 1. Code Section 2-64.11(a), "Fees for Recreational Programs," hereby is amended as follows:

The summer recreation fee for the first child in a family is increased from \$250.00 to \$300.00 and the summer recreation fee for each additional family member is increased from \$225.00 to \$275.00.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent necessary.

If any article, section, subsection, term or condition of this Ordinance is declared invalid or illegal for any reason, the balance of the Ordinance shall be deemed severable and shall remain in full force and effect.

This Ordinance shall take effect after publication and passage according to law.

Councilman Marinaro seconded the motion and it carried on voice vote.

Councilman Vroom moved to open the meeting to a Public Hearing on this ordinance; seconded by Councilman Marinaro and carried on voice vote.

Since there was no one who wished to speak under the Public Hearing, Councilman Vroom moved that it be closed; seconded by Councilman Marinaro and carried on voice vote.
