### RESOLUTION 2020-11.5 OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE, COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO ESTABLISH REMOTE MEETING PROCEDURES APPLICABLE DURING A DECLARED STATE OF EMERGENCY

**WHEREAS**, on March 9, 2020 in response to COVID-19, Governor Phil Murphy issued Executive Order 103, which declared a state of emergency that has been extended by the Governor and remains in full force to this day; and

**WHEREAS**, by way of additional Executive Orders, the Governor has established extensive social distancing protocols to protect the health, safety and welfare of New Jersey citizens; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Executive Orders relating to COVID-19 and the Open

Public Meetings Act, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 10:4-6 <u>et seq.</u> ("OPMA"), local government units, including the Borough of Bloomingdale, continued to hold public meetings via remote platforms to ensure the continued operation of local government with participation by the public, in a way that limits public health risk; and

**WHEREAS**, although the Borough of Bloomingdale has moved to a meeting format wherein in-person attendance is permitted pursuant to occupancy limitations, the Borough recognizes that meetings may return to remote only if necessary; and

**WHEREAS**, in March 2020, the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services ("DLGS") issued "Local Operational Guidance – COVID-19: Guidance for Remote Public Meetings in New Jersey," which provided specific guidance regarding holding remote public meetings under the OPMA; and

**WHEREAS,** on September 24, 2020, the DLGS issued Local Finance Notice 2020-21 ("LFN 2020-21"), which provided a synopsis of newly promulgated emergency regulations <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:39-1.1 through 1.7, which establish standard protocols for remote public meetings governed by the OPMA and held during a Governor-declared state of emergency; and

**WHEREAS,** LFN 2020-21 additionally stated that the emergency regulations presently in effect are proposed for permanent adoption in the October 19, 2020 New Jersey Register, with comments submitted no later than November 18, 2020; and

**WHEREAS,** under emergency regulation <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:39-1.4(h), a local government unit is required to adopt by resolution standard procedures and requirements for public comment made during remote public meetings, as well as for public comments submitted in writing ahead of the remote public meeting.

### RESOLUTION NO. 2020-11.6 OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE, COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A CONTRACT TO POWER PLACE INC. FOR GAS POWERED PORTABLE GENERATORS THROUGH ESCNJ CO-OP #65MCESCCPS

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Bloomingdale wish to purchase Portable Generators for the Department of Public Works; and

**WHEREAS**, said equipment may be purchased from Power Place through ESCNJ Bid No. 18/19-09 (Generator Equipment and Maintenance); and

**WHEREAS**, the maximum amount of the contract is not to exceed \$9,000.00, and the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of funds in the annexed certification; and

**WHEREAS,** public bids are not required when the purchase is made through a cooperative pricing system in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(6) of the Local Public Contracts Law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey, that a contract for the purchase of Gas Powered Portable Generators is hereby awarded to Power Place, of Rockaway, NJ, in accordance with the terms and conditions contained in ESCNJ Bid No. 18/19-09, and the Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to execute same.

### RESOLUTION NO. 2020-11.7 OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE

### AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF THE 2020 PASSAIC COUNTY, NEW JERSEY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN UPDATE

**WHEREAS**, all jurisdictions within Passaic County have exposure to hazards that increase the risk to life, property, environment, and the County and local economy; and

**WHEREAS**; pro-active mitigation of known hazards before a disaster event can reduce or eliminate long-term risk to life and property; and

**WHEREAS**, The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106-390) established new requirements for pre and post disaster hazard mitigation programs; and

**WHEREAS**; a coalition of Passaic County municipalities with like planning objectives has been formed to pool resources and create consistent mitigation strategies within Passaic County; and

**WHEREAS**, the coalition has completed a planning process that engages the public, assesses the risk and vulnerability to the impacts of natural hazards, develops a mitigation strategy consistent with a set of uniform goals and objectives, and creates a plan for implementing, evaluating and revising this strategy;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough of Bloomingdale:

- 1) Adopts in its entirety, the 2020 Passaic County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update (the "Plan") as the jurisdiction's Hazard Mitigation Plan and resolves to execute the actions identified in the Plan that pertain to this jurisdiction.
- 2) Will use the adopted and approved portions of the Plan to guide pre- and post-disaster mitigation of the hazards identified.
- 3) Will coordinate the strategies identified in the Plan with other planning programs and mechanisms under its jurisdictional authority.
- 4) Will continue its support of the Mitigation Planning Committee as described within the Plan.
- 5) Will help to promote and support the mitigation successes of all participants in this Plan.
- 6) Will incorporate mitigation planning as an integral component of government and partner operations.
- 7) Will provide an update of the Plan in conjunction with the County no less than every five years.

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Bloomingdale, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11 and N.J.A.C. 5:34-7.3 et seq. may, by Resolution and without advertising for bids, purchase any goods or services through the Hunterdon County Education Services Commission ("HCESC"), which has been approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Bloomingdale has a need for an access control system throughout the various Borough Buildings; and

**WHEREAS,** Sonitrol has been awarded Contract #HCESC-TECH-17-01 for Comprehensive Safety & Security System Evaluations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Full-time Mayor recommends the utilization of this contract on the grounds as the best means to obtain access control systems; and

**WHEREAS**, the amended contract shall not exceed the amount of \$63,000 and the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of funds in the annexed certification; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Bloomingdale, County of Passaic and State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. The Borough of Bloomingdale hereby authorizes the award of contract to Sonitrol for access control systems under the HCESC Contract #HCESC-TECH-17-01.
- 2. The total fee authorized for this contract shall not exceed \$63,000.00 without the prior written approval of the Borough Council.
- 3. The Full-time Mayor, Borough Clerk and/or such other officials as is necessary and proper are hereby authorized to execute documents necessary to implement this Resolution.
- 4. A copy of this resolution shall be provided to the Finance Department and Sonitrol for their information and guidance.

### RESOLUTION NO. 2020-11.9 OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE

# RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE, COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING WAIVER OF LIEN ENFORCEMENT FOR DELINQUENT WATER AND SEWER UTILITY ACCOUNTS

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Bloomingdale has been impacted by the Governor's Declaration of Public Health Emergency, and subsequent extensions of same, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council recognizes that the financial impact of the Public Health Emergency has had on the residents of Bloomingdale; and

**WHEREAS**, as per the Local Finance Notice 2020-25 of October 15, 2020 and pursuant to P.L. 2020, c. 39, enacted on June 19, 2020, the Borough may delay enforcement measures with regard to certain delinquent utility accounts; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Borough Council have reviewed P.L. 2020, c. 39 and determined that such waiver is in the best interests of the Borough.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Bloomingdale, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey, that lien enforcement as to delinquent water and sewer utility accounts shall be waived for the duration of the Declaration of Public Health Emergency as follows:

- 1) The Borough will refrain from submitting a property for tax sale due to unpaid balance, service charge, and interest that may accrue on outstanding balances.
- 2) The Borough will refrain from discontinuing service to any property for failure to make payment on any amount owed for water or sewer utility services.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
