2022 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

A. <u>Second/Final Reading and Public Hearing</u> Ordinance No. 12-2022: 2022 Index Rate CAP Bank Ordinance

The Municipal Clerk, Breeanna Smith, read the Public Notice statement.

Councilwoman HUDSON moved that the Ordinance be read by title; seconded by YAZDI and carried on voice vote – all members present voting AYE

The Municipal Clerk read the following Ordinance by title:

ORDINANCE NO. 12-2022 OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF <u>THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE</u>

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale, in the County of Passaic, finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 Budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$98,077.98 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Bloomingdale, in the County of Passaic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Bloomingdale shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$343,272.96, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Borough of Bloomingdale be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be uploaded on the FAST System for the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be uploaded on the FAST System for the said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

ORDINANCE NO 17-2022 OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE, IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION", ARTICLE IV "BOROUGH OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES", SECTION 2-12 "PUBLIC DEFENDER" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE

WHEREAS, with regard to the Public Defender, the Borough Code currently sets forth the application process; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Administrator has determined that the Code should include the qualifications and duties of the Public Defender; and

WHEREAS, certain changes are recommended in order to clarify the position; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has reviewed and accepted the recommended changes as being in the best interest of the Borough.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Borough of Bloomingdale, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2 "Administration", Article IV "Borough Officers and Employees", Section 2-12 "Public Defender" shall be amended to read as follows:

§2-12.1 Qualifications.

The Public Defender shall be an attorney at law of the State of New Jersey in good standing.

§2-12.2 Duties.

The Public Defender shall perform the duties of Municipal Public Defender in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey and the ordinances of the Borough.

§ 2-12.3 Appointment.

The Public Defender shall be appointed by the Council and shall hold office for a term of one year from the date of appointment as prescribed by law.

§2-12.4 Part-Time Position; Compensation.

The office of the Public Defender shall be a part-time office, and the Public Defender shall receive compensation as provided in the Salary Ordinance for his or her attendance at sessions of the Municipal Court. The Public Defender shall receive such other compensation for additional work performed as authorized by the Mayor and Council.

§2-12.5 Application for Representation by Public Defender.

Any person entitled by law to appointment of counsel may apply to the Municipal Court for representation by a Municipal Public Defender in any action pending before the Court. Such application shall be accompanied by an application fee in the amount of \$200. Upon request of the applicant, the Municipal Court may waive the application fee, in whole or in part, if the Court determines, in its discretion, upon clear and convincing showing by the applicant that the application fee represents an unreasonable burden on the person seeking representation.

Funds collected by the Borough pursuant to this Section shall be deposited in a dedicated fund administered by the CFO of the Borough. Such funds shall be used exclusively to meet the costs incurred in providing the services of a public defender including, when required, expert and lay investigation and testimony.

All other portions of this Chapter not addressed herein shall remain unchanged.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Borough of Bloomingdale inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.
