**ORDINANCE NO. 22-2025
OF THE GOVERNING BODY
OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE, IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 7 “TRAFFIC”, SECTION 7-13 “PARKING TIME LIMITED ON CERTAIN STREETS” OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE

WHEREAS, the Borough Code currently sets forth standards and regulations relating to traffic on the streets of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the County Road Department is conducting sidewalk improvements along Main Street and Reeve Avenue which will impact availability of parking spaces; and

WHEREAS, the Bloomingdale Police Department has reviewed the anticipated impacts of the construction and recommends the implementation of time-limited parking in the affected area to promote turnover and ensure continued access to local businesses for their customers; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has reviewed and accepted the recommended changes as being in the best interest of the Borough.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Borough of Bloomingdale, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 7 “Traffic”, 7-13 PARKING TIME LIMITED ON CERTAIN STREETS, Section 7-13.1 Time Limit Parking shall be amended to add as follows:

§7-13.1 Time Limited Parking

No person shall park a vehicle for longer than the time limit between the hours listed on any day (except Sundays and public holidays) upon any of the streets or parts of streets described.

All other portions of this Chapter not addressed herein shall remain unchanged.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Borough of Bloomingdale inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR THE USE OF
MUNICIPAL COURT FACILITY IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY BETWEEN THE
BOROUGH OF POMPTON LAKES AND THE BOROUGH OF BLOOMINGDALE**

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. (the “Act”), authorizes local units of this State to enter into an agreement with any other local unit or units to provide or receive any service that each local unit participating in the agreement is empowered to provide or receive in its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, in the event that either municipality is in the emergent need of the services of a municipal court facility to hold and adjudicate its municipal court matters that would typically be held in their own municipal building (the "Services"), the municipalities are willing to assist the other by permitting the municipality to hold its weekly municipal court sessions in the other municipal court room one (1) day per week as long as necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Bodies of Pompton Lakes and Bloomingdale have determined that it is in the mutual best interest of each municipality to provide the use of the other’s municipal court room.

WHEREAS, said agreement shall be effective for a period of one (1) year, commencing on January 1, 2026 and terminating December 31, 2026.; and

WHEREAS, execution of said agreement is authorized pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Bloomingdale, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey that the Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to execute an Interlocal Shared Services Agreement with the Borough of Pompton Lakes for the use of municipal court room in the event of an emergency.
